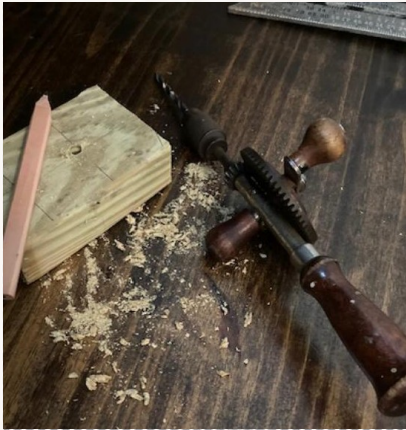

PERFORMANCE & USE How does it perform?

How it works: Hand-cranked gear drives drill

Ease of use: Easy operation, minimal learning

Durability: Built for decades of use

Maintenance: Oil occasionally to prevent rust

Practical applications: Repairs, projects, emergency drilling

Pros: No batteries needed, quiet operation, easy to repair, durable construction

Cons: Slower than cordless drills, requires physical effort, limited drilling speed, difficult replacement parts, not ideal production
